


Leadership failures and development challenges in Africa

GDP per Capita 1960 - 2019





Covid-19 Governance



As of today: 3.2 M cases and 79,899 deaths. Why?

- Establishment of taskforces at regional and national levels has enabled significant centralization and multi-disciplinary/sectoral engagement
- AU and Africa CDC coordinated continental response with ECOWAS supporting member states through coordination and strategic plans (<u>OECD</u>)
- Additionally, Presidential and Prime Ministerial Covid-19 taskforces have included:
 - Ministries (health, education, youth)
 - Technical experts in epidemiology (Africa CDC/WHO)
 - Governance policy (UNDP)
 - Economic policy (WACB)



Mauritius

- Strong preexisting public healthcare system
- Government promptly committed ~\$300 mil.
- Screening at airports beginning Jan 22
- Prime Minister spoke to public daily, developed free mobile app to provide information
- Highest lockdown stringency rating (Hale et al. 2020), including a controversial but effective sanitary curfew
- Contact tracing prioritized, fever clinics built for isolation
- Primary school classes available online and broadcast on TV
