initiatives.









# **Vocational Training**



In partnership with Caterpillar Foundation, Malaika built and opened two new vocational programs for area women and men (aged 18-35).

These are technical programs in mechanics and electrician studies. We will initially have 80 total participants, who will become nationally certified in relevant skills for successful employment.





## Wells

The wells we've built over the course of 15 years are a key part of how we've supported a region in Congo during the pandemic.

Together, this 25-well system is providing access to clean water for more than 35,000 people a year.
